## **For female patients, including girls and adolescents and their parents/caregivers:**

- Do not start Mint-Teriflunomide if you are pregnant, or you think you may be pregnant. Your doctor should administer a pregnancy test before you start taking MINT-Teriflunomide to make sure.
- You must use effective contraception while and after using teriflunomide.
- Your doctor will provide counselling on the potential risks of teriflunomide to an unborn baby and on the need for effective contraception and will discuss starting its use.
- Contact your doctor if you want to change contraception method or if you are planning to become pregnant.
- If you become pregnant, are late starting your period or have any reason to suspect pregnancy while taking Mint-Teriflunomide or within 2 years after stopping it, tell your doctor right away.
- In the event of a pregnancy, please contact the Teriflunomide Enhanced Pharmacovigilance Pregnancy Active Surveillance Program at 1-877-398-9696 or email us at [drugsafety@mintpharma.com](mailto:drugsafety@mintpharma.com). The purpose of an Enhanced Pregnancy Surveillance Program is to provide data on the effect of Mint-Teriflunomide exposure during pregnancy.
- In case of pregnancy, your doctor may suggest treatment with certain medicines to speed up the removal of teriflunomide from your body.
- You should also discuss with your doctor if you plan to or are breastfeeding.

# MINT-Teriflunomide Patient Card

## Important side effects

This drug may affect your liver function and certain cells in your blood, including cells that are important to fight infections. Therefore, blood tests, liver tests and blood pressure will be checked before the start of the treatment and regularly thereafter.

## What are possible side effects from using Mint-Teriflunomide:

These are not all the possible side effects you may have when taking Mint-Teriflunomide. If you experience any side effects not listed here, tell your healthcare professional.

- diarrhea, nausea, flu or sinus infection, upset stomach, abdominal pain
- rash
- Yellow skin or yellowing of the whites of your eyes (jaundice), darker urine than normal
- hair thinning or loss
- cold sores
- toothache
- shortness of breath
- frequent urination
- having your period for longer than 7 days
- sore muscles
- weight loss
